The great discoverer's siblings and their children all live here. Many of his family members are also well known for their prowess in various endeavors. Perhaps you have heard of some of them? Quadra Macintosh (sister) and L. C. Macintosh III (brother) co-developed the printing press used in Schulmania. S. E. Macintosh (nephew) patented new formats for accounting in Schulmania. Claris Macintosh (ex-wife) was a prolific writer. Twins E. and I. Macintosh developed a courier system for Schulmania. Messages can be sent via horseback and by ferry for only 2 purrs anywhere in Schulmania. Delivery takes only 1-7 days.
